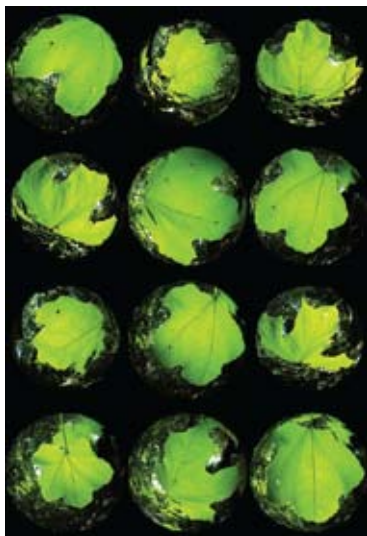

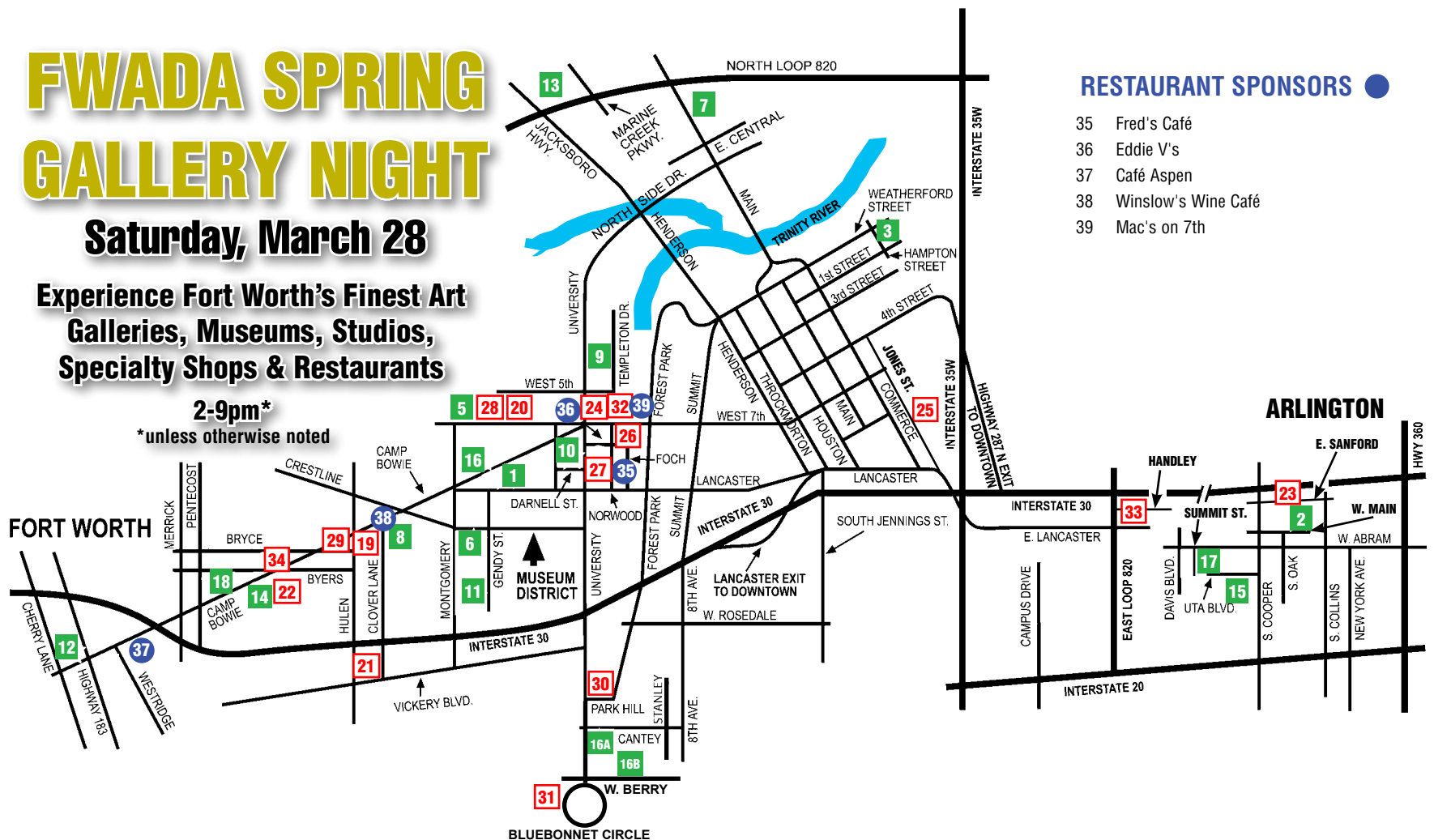

Fort Worth Contemporary Arts: Margrét H. Blöndal & Lars Laumann

This exhibition takes the form of two intertwined solo exhibitions. Margrét H. Blöndal works primarily in a sculptural medium that utilizes found domestic elements to create installations that suggest quixotic reference or function. In their materiality they are most often light and somewhat ephemeral, evoking an existence in a marginal space or uncompleted form. While Lars Laumann has repeatedly turned to popular culture, mining the Internet for material and content for his videos.

“I was on a journey to create the perfect pedestal for my objects to rest on. Somewhere in that journey I got lost in the form and the structure of the pedestal. Through various firings the pedestals begin to take a life of their own, and it is through this transformative process that past notions of the pedestal form and function quickly dissolve.” - Joel Kiser

John Holt Smith: *Opiates and Oculi*

New works on aluminum panel using fields of poppies or the iris of the human eye as his 'source image', John Holt Smith morphs that image into colorful, minimal paintings utilizing enamel paint and the airbrush. Using 'imaging spectrometry', slices of his digital images are transformed via computer technology into thousands of thin bands. The result, utilizing layering, gradation, intensity and tonal shifts, are linear paintings that become formal encounters with color.
